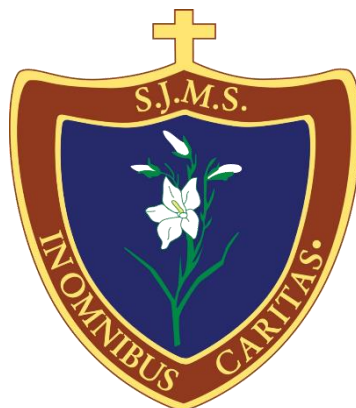

## Expectations

### School Uniform

Each child is expected to wear the appropriate school uniform. Our [uniform policy](#) can be found on the school website, along with the information for the [school uniform shop](#). To find out when your child is expected to wear the PE uniform, please refer to page 5 of this handbook.

### Daily Routines and Bell Times (Bridge St)

**7am** – Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) opens, please ensure you have booked via the iParent Portal (email [oshc@sjms.catholic.edu.au](mailto:oshc@sjms.catholic.edu.au) for more information).

**8:30am** – Supervision begins. Children who arrive before this time will need to be supervised by their parent/caregiver or be booked into Out of School Hours Care.

**8:55am** – The morning bell will ring and the class will gather for our school day to commence. Absentees are noted, children arriving after the bell will need to sign in at the front office.

**11am -11.30am** - Recess

**1pm – 1:40pm** - Lunch

**3pm** – The afternoon bell will ring and our school day will conclude.

**3:15pm** – OSHC opens and will collect the children booked into After School Care from the supervising teachers.

**3:30pm** – After school supervision finishes.

**6pm** – OSHC closes.

### Absentees

If a student is unable to attend school, parents and caregivers are asked to contact the School Office on 8130 7777 or submit an online absentee form via the Skoolbag app.

## **Out of School Hours Care (OSHC)**

OSHC operates at both campuses from 7-8:30am and 3:15-6pm during the term. Vacation Care is available during the school holidays – all information is available from the OSHC Service.

## **Sun Protection Policy**

Students are to wear their school hat in Terms 1, 3 and 4 whenever outside. Students are to wear their school hat in Terms 2 when the UV rating is advertised as 3 or above for the day. Students who do not have a hat on these days will be required to stay in the shade. Sunscreen is provided by the school.

## **Birthdays**

We make every effort to celebrate your child's birthday in the classroom. To eliminate competition and further expense for parents, we ask that you don't provide treats or gifts to the class. The focus is entirely upon your child and celebrating their special day. We request that invitations be given to parents outside of the classroom so that children who are not invited are not disappointed or aware.

## **Food Packaging**

Schools play an important role in fostering core ecological values. Learning to care for our environment is essential, as it influences how our students will care for their common home.

In *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis highlights the important role that education plays:

*There is a nobility in the duty to care for creation through little daily actions, and it is wonderful how education can bring about real changes in lifestyle. Education in environmental responsibility can encourage ways of acting which directly and significantly affect the world around us, such as avoiding the use of plastic. (211)*

At SJMS we encourage healthy, nude food. Nude food is food without excess packaging, which reduces the amount of rubbish that needs to go in bins. Durable, reusable containers are a great way to bring food, as they may last from Pre-school through to High School and beyond, providing long term cost savings and environmental benefits. We ask that used food wrappers/packaging be placed back into lunchboxes and taken home for disposal.

## **Home Learning**

Your child has been provided with a Home Learning and Communication book. Please use the Home Reading Sheet located inside the book to record your child's daily reading at home. Year 1 students will also have a weekly spelling list to focus on for the week.

### **Morning routines:**

Each morning, students are asked to place their water bottle and their healthy snack containers into the trays located inside the classroom, by the door. Pieces of fruit for healthy snack time can remain in their lunchbox. Recess and lunch will remain in student's lunch boxes in schoolbags. On days of extreme heat, lunchboxes will be brought inside the classroom.

### **Ice Blocks**

In Term 1 and Term 4 students are able to purchase an ice block for 50 cents. Money is collected in the classroom each morning and ice blocks are distributed at lunchtime. There is also the option for sugar free ice blocks (50c). This will begin on the first day.

## Personal Responsibility

### **Restorative Practice**

The Personal Responsibility Policy supports the growth of each person, their dignity, uniqueness and their relationship with others. The development of social and emotional competencies and personal and social responsibility contribute to the life-long learning of all students and preparation for active participation in the wider community.

At SJMS we use Restorative Practice to support our students take responsibility for their actions. Restorative Practice is a strategy that seeks to repair relationships that have been damaged. It does this by bringing about a sense of remorse and restorative action on the part of the offender and forgiveness by the victim.

The rationale behind this approach is that when offenders reflect upon their harm to victims:

- They become remorseful and act restoratively.
- Practitioners can focus on the unacceptable behaviour of offenders rather than their moral character.
- This can lead to healthier interpersonal relations among members of the school community and more effective learning.

# Communication

## Newsletters

Newsletters are a great way to keep up to date with your child's learning, curriculum topics and other events. Whole school newsletters will be distributed to the community via the school website and Skoolbag app every fortnight. Class newsletters will be sent once a term via email and also available on the school website and Skoolbag app.

## Parent/Teacher Communication

If you are unable to speak to your classroom teacher before or after school, alternatives include email and making an appointment. We will endeavour to respond as soon as possible.

## Reporting

We are passionate about promoting success for all learners and developing effective family partnerships. We achieve this by ensuring that our reporting process includes a combination of Learning Conversations, written reports and a Learning Journey.

**Learning Conversations** will be held twice a year (Term 1 and Term 3) and will allow us the opportunity to discuss your child's individual learning goals.

Detailed **written reports** will be provided at the end of each semester. Reports are prepared once we have consolidated and moderated students' work and assessment tasks across the year level.

A **Learning Journey** event will be held in Term 3, where you are invited into the classroom to participate in your child's learning and celebrate their achievements.

SJMS is an online community. To ensure that you are always aware of alerts and updates, we highly recommend downloading our Skoolbag App.

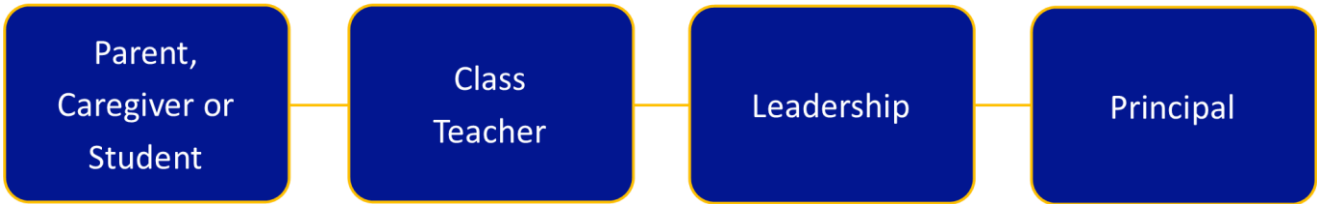
