Exploration Time, Academic Rigour & Weaving Pedagogies

Exploration time is an important part of children's learning. It is purposeful, aiming to ignite children's interest and offers academic rigour. Therefore, we ask that you use this time to support your children's learning by engaging in the experiences with them.







According to Professor Peter Freebody the syllabus guidelines indicate that students should experience a strongly related mix of the academic, the applied, the knowledge and the inquiry based learning approaches. Professor Allan Luke also supports this through his studies related to successful teaching and learning. He refers to the Mastery of Teaching, a Pluralistic Pedagogical approach where the teacher can adapt the method according to the children and what needs to be taught. He warns

of the mistake of walking into a room, noticing a particular approach at a given time and thinking this is not the valued style assuming that good teaching is not in practice. Different styles and approaches suit different situations.

I want our children to be successful, able to participate and choose. My work which is my genuine passion and vocation in life is backed by research striving to link theory with practice while working alongside your children. Each year the way in which I go about my efforts to support your children's knowledge building and understanding differs according to the cohort I have been blessed with. Therefore, acknowledging the gifts each member brings to the Community and respecting what people wish to contribute to and participate in whist striving to manage and address the mandated curriculum.

This approach is an intricate process which takes time and deep consideration for all the many components involved. I continue to welcome your critical and constructive feedback which helps to build our positive Community of Inquiry where we learn and share together. Teacher Learning - CESA's Live, Learn, Lead Together & Wayne's Brabbin's Ignatian Spirituality

These initiatives have helped us to celebrate our Catholic identity especially during these challenging times, to renew our understanding of our purpose as Educators and remembering the good that the Church has done and continues to do. At the same time, it is imperative that we know and learn from the past, acknowledge the human condition, recognise the truth and strive to improve and not make the same mistakes again.

One of the most significant points that stood out for me after writing my paper was Doctor Kent Hoffman's take on how very difficult it is for human kind to be in good relationship especially with the pressures to do so much, to be more efficient and to acquire more knowledge. He articulates that this is not really nearly as important as being in relationship with others, slowing down and being present with one another and connecting heart to heart. Hoffman shares that suffering comes from not being able to slow down and be in relationship with those around us. Vicar General Father Philip Marshall spoke of our infinite worth. Doctor Kent Hoffman expressed this infinite worth within each of us as

the gate of Heaven, that is being everywhere, within each one of us. This reminded me of Sister Miriam Frances song, 'God is Dwelling in my Heart' inspired by 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own?"







Religious Education - Our Lenten Journey

We are aiming to reflect God's love and brighten up each other's day by the kind choices we make. The building of our class candle, filled with the children's flames, describing their special acts of kindness has been very supportive. Their Lenten promises have also helped them on their journey to choose to follow in Jesus' footsteps.

We are looking forward to working with Miss Hoare's Year 2/3 class to 'Walk for Water' to raise money for Caritas. It will be an opportunity for children to understand that there are children in the world who have to work very hard for the bare essentials and how we must work together for justice and equity. We are also very excited about working with our Reception and Year 1 Buddies to participate in a 'Book Swap' to also help raise money for Caritas. These experiences will help to develop children's understanding of Lent and will be extended to our literacy and numeracy programs through reading, writing, sorting, counting and measuring, the number of coins collected.





Literacy

The children have responded well to our Oral Language, Jolly Phonics, Reading and Writing programs. They are recognising letters, learning how to form them and using correct pencil grip. Children are developing their abilities to hear sounds in words making connections with listening, speaking, reading and writing. This is supported through our daily encounters with meetings, shared learning, story time and recording our thoughts and ideas.







Numeracy

The children have been exploring a variety of experiences to establish an understanding of number, order, sequence, pattern and position in relation to familiar experiences. They have been working together as a whole class to help one another devise a number of ways to solve problems related to our shared experiences.







Our Buddy Classes

The children were delighted to meet their Year 2/3 buddies in Miss Hoare's class. They have spent time talking to them, getting to know more about them, their interests and their families. We were very grateful for our buddies' support during Carnevale and Saint Joseph's day celebrations.

Singing with Cathy's Reception Blue Class is a weekly highlight where we practise articulation, rhyme and songs of praise.

Our Garden Project

The children have been busy making mud pies, weeding, watering, feeding and maintaining our garden. They also enjoy sitting, praying and reflecting in 'Our Garden of Gethsemane'. We are in the process of renewing our garden bed behind our classroom. If you would like to support this initiative, we would appreciate some potting mix please.







Plants, Animals and Our Science Curriculum - Biological Sciences: Living Things

The children have been enchanted by our visiting hopping mice. They particular enjoyed the caterpillars along with our tadpoles that underwent metamorphosis transforming into butterflies and frogs. We are very grateful to our friends at the Nature Education Centre many of whom volunteer. One of the volunteers is an elderly lady who takes time to collect the milkweed and caterpillars for the centre.







The children enjoy doing observational drawings, paintings and sculptures of plants and animals. We work together to write science reports about the nature we encounter and are in the process of collecting data to choose names for our animals. Our Zebra Danio & White Cloud fish are healthy and calming to gaze and wonder about. Our Love Birds Light and Bella are intriguing to watch as they build their nest and care for their young. The Stick and Leaf Insects enjoy feeding upon lush gum leaves.

We observe and notice the connections between plants, animals and what is needed to survive. We eagerly care for living things taking pride in the privilege to be able to share and experience nature first hand.
